Reconciliation and Allyship Experts Unpack Controversy Surrounding The Referendum

Aboriginal Elder, Barrister and LinkedIn Top Voice, <u>Aunty Munya Andrews</u>, and Churchill Fellow and Ally, <u>Carla Rogers</u>, will be running a webinar on Monday for individuals and organisations who want to have a better understanding of the upcoming referendum.

"We're not here to tell you how to vote", assures Carla Rogers. "Our job, as cultural awareness trainers, is to educate and inspire Allies to make an informed decision."

"I am often asked, what do Aboriginal people want?" says Aunty Munya. "My response is that the Indigenous community of Australia is as diverse as any other, we have a range of different opinions and views."

In the public webinar on Monday 13 February, Aunty Munya and Carla aim to share practical information and resources to help people better understand what is being asked in the upcoming referendum, why we are being asked, and how to show up as an Ally.
